Strategies promoting active learning are superior to passive learning (lectures) in promoting the development of student's skills in thinking and writing (Bonwell and Eison, 1991, iii). Active learning accommodates a variety of learning styles, promotes student achievement, enhances learner motivation, changes student attitudes, and basically, causes learners to learn more (Astin, 1985).
