* Antifreeze * is a chemical, primarily consisting of ethylene glycol, which when mixed with water serves to lower the freezing point and raise the boiling point of the mixture.

Antifreeze, usually ethylene glycol, does not freeze easily. It also does not boil easily. When it is added to water, it becomes coolant.

What's the Difference Between Antifreeze and Coolant?

Common antifreeze is made of ethylene glycol, a known toxin. This sweet smelling green liquid is easily spilled when topping up your antifreeze reservoir under the hood.

Greening Your Car with Non-toxic Alternatives

It is usually used with additives, like corrosion inhibitors and antifreeze. Antifreeze, a solution of a suitable organic chemical (most often ethylene glycol, diethylene glycol, or propylene glycol) in water, is used when the water-based coolant has to withstand temperatures below 0 °C, or when its boiling point has to be raised.

The main ingredient in the coolant used today is ethylene glycol. If it is mixed correctly (a 50/50 mix of antifreeze and water is ideal), the ethylene glycol can keep your radiator fluid from freezing even in temperatures reaching as low as 30 degrees below zero and also keep those fluids from boiling in temperatures reaching as high as 275 degrees Fahrenheit.
