Did she walk, skip, amble, dance? In this minilesson, students examine the simple sentence "She walked into the room." Volunteers act out ways that the student in the sentence might enter the room, and the teacher models revising the sample sentence accordingly. Students then suggest other replacements for the verb in the sentence to increase the specificity of the word and explore connotation.

Students often confuse denotation and connotation, not distinguishing that denotation is the literal, dictionary definition of a word, while its counterpart, connotation is a term that refers to the feelings or images a word evokes in the reader. Just saying the definitions of both terms means absolutely nothing to students.
