License Privileges: All VHF/UHF Amateur bands and most HF privileges (10 through 160 meters). The General Class license is the second of three US Amateur Radio licenses. To upgrade to General Class, you must already hold a Technician Class license (or have recently passed the Technician license exam). Upgrading to a General license—which conveys extensive HF privileges—only requires passing a written examination.

To get the license, you'll need to pass a test in order to prove that you have the knowledge and skills necessary to use your radio equipment responsibly and safely. There are three different ham radio licenses available.

The General class license grants some operating privileges on all Amateur Radio bands and all operating modes. This license opens the door to world-wide communications. Earning the General class license requires passing a 35 question examination. General class licensees must also have passed the Technician written examination.

General, Advanced and Amateur Extra classes: Effective March 5, 2012, amateurs are permitted to use CW and phone, as well as digital modes that comply with emission designator 60H0J2B, which includes PSK31 as well as any RTTY signal with a bandwidth of less than 60 Hz.

The 2019 - 2023 General Class (Element 3) Question Pool is available in Word, ASCII text, and PDF versions. The new Question Pool is effective for Element 3 exams administered on or after July 1, 2019. The 1,500 watt USA General class license can be considered the equivalent of UK Intermediate or CEPT Novice or Australian Standard.

New Amateur / Ham Radio General Class Question Pool ...

A ham with a General class (or higher) license administered the exam. Originally, the license was good for a single year, at which point the Novice upgraded or had to get off the air. These days, the Novice license, like other licenses, has a ten-year term and is renewable.

Types of Ham Radio Operator Licenses - dummies

Most new amateur operators start at the Technician Class and then may advance to the General Class or Amateur Extra Class operator license. The VEs give examination credit for the license class currently held so that examinations required for that license need not be repeated.
