The previous guidelines initiated screening 3 years after beginning sexual activity but no later than age 21. Women younger than 30 were recommended to have a Pap test every 2 years. For women 30 or older, the recommendation was every 3 years if they had had 3 consecutive negative Pap tests.

The new pap smear guidelines (2012) recommend that most women between the ages of 30 and 65 get a pap smear only every five years. The reason for this change from every 3 years, or in some cases every year, is that each pap smear sample is now tested two ways (this is called "co-testing").

Consistent with the 2013 ASCCP updated guidelines for the management of abnormal screening results, the ACS recommended in their 2015 screening update that women with ASC-US cytology and negative HPV co-testing should return for screening in three years.

Current Cervical Carcinoma Screening Guidelines

Avoid intercourse, douching, or using any vaginal medicines or spermicidal foams, creams or jellies for two days before having a Pap smear, as these may wash away or obscure abnormal cells. Try not to schedule a Pap smear during your menstrual period. It's best to avoid this time of your cycle, if possible. What you can expect During the Pap smear

Pap smear - Mayo Clinic

Recommend against screening women aged <21 years. (D recommendation). Age 21 regardless of the age of onset of sexual activity. Women aged <21 years should not be screened regardless of age at sexual initiation and other behavior-related risk factors. (Level A evidence).

Cervical Cancer Screening Guidelines for Average-Risk Women

Women aged 21 to 65 years. The USPSTF recommends screening for cervical cancer every 3 years with cervical cytology alone in women aged 21 to 29 years. For women aged 30 to 65 years, the USPSTF recommends screening every 3 years with cervical cytology alone, every 5 years with high-risk human papillomavirus (hrHPV) testing alone, or every 5 years with hrHPV testing in combination with cytology (cotesting).

Why More is Not Always Better: New Pap Smear Guidelines ...

The Pap smear test has been replaced by a new HPV cervical screening test with reflex liquid-based cytology (LBC) for oncogenic HPV positive samples. Evidence shows that HPV-based cervical screening is more sensitive than Pap smear screening, will detect high-grade cervical lesions earlier, and will prevent more cervical cancers.

RACGP - Prevention and early detection of cervical cancer

Any abnormal results should be explained in detail as well as any recommended follow up testing and plan of care. If this is not your experience, demand better; ask questions and if possible consider finding a new provider. When getting a pap smear, be sure that your provider uses lubrication on the speculum.
